



Even though a product may be small enough to be flushed, does not mean it should be. Flushing items that are not meant to be flushed, including those labeled *flushable*, can lead to problems in the sewer system, at the wastewater treatment facility, and for the environment.

Things to NEVER flush
Baby Wipes and Diapers (including 'flushable' or 'disposable'): These highly absorbe synthetic materials are slow to breakdown and can clog sewer systems.
Paper Towels: Just like wipes, these common household items are designed to not breakdown when wet and absorb liquids.
Cotton Balls, Cosmetic Pads and Cotton Swabs: These non-flushable items tend to gather in pipe bends causing blockages.
Dental Floss: This little string can cause havoc to plumbing and sewer systems.
Medications or Supplements: Wastewater treatment facilities are not designed to breakdown pharmaceuticals. While drugs may dilute in the waste stream, studies have shown the presence of medicines such as steroid hormones and antidepressants in wastewater effluent.
Medical Supplies: Razors, bandages and hypodermic needles are often flushed, but quite simply, they don't degrade. The razor blades, needles also present a danger to employees w need to remove the items that clog the system.
Rubber: Items such as latex gloves and condoms are made of a material that is not intended to breakdown in liquid.
Feminine Hygiene Products (sanitary napkins, tampons and applicators): Like cat lit these products are designed to absorb liquids and swell in the process, clog pipes, get strin bends and block sewer lines.
Fats, Oil, and Grease: Known in the wastewater industry as 'FOG', are liquids that solidify when cooled, and this creates significant problems for public wastewater systems, as well drains in your home.
Cat Litter (including 'flushable'): The absorbent properties of litter are designed to 'clum and will clog sewer systems.
Hair: Like dental floss, flushed hair can cause tangled blockages ensnaring everything tha passes by.
Food Products - bananapeels, applecores, leftovers, etc: While these may degrade over time, food products simply do not disintegrate fast enough and can cause blockages throughout the system.
Trash of any kind: All this litter does not easily biodegrade.
Candy and other foodwrappers
Cigarette butts Rags
Plastic Bags
Chemicals: Paint, automotive fluids, solvents, and poisons, are just terrible pollutants to flush. Just as wastewater treatment plants are not designed to screen out pharmaceutical: these facilities are not designed to eliminate toxic chemicals.
Heavy Metals: These pollutants include mercury, cadmium, arsenic, lithium (think batterie and lead, etc. Please dispose of any of these toxins properly to prevent harm to the environment and the potential for serious health risks.



Student Artwork brightens patient rooms in Ashern's Lakeshore General Hospital

"To kick off the project, we met with each group individually and told them about the project and the goal was to make something that would make someone feel happy. We discussed the importance of simplicity, they did a little research on hospital murals and as soon as they saw inspiration, they sketched rough design and went to the woodshop space and sketched it out and created final project," says Kosolowski. "The educational assistant worked hard to support the students on this project too. The best part is that many live near the hospital or know family that do so they were so proud and excited to tell their aunts, uncles, grandparents about what they did at school for the local hospital."

Interlake-Eastern Regional Health Authority CEO Marion Ellis thanked everyone for their involvement.

"Thank you to Shelley and everyone at Ashern Central School for going out of their way to provide the patients in the hospital with a warm, cheery murals for their rooms while we undergo construction. We've heard from patients' comments that the artwork is appreciated.," says Ellis.

The construction project is expanding the emergency department with additional treatment space and increasing the number of inpatient beds. The plywood murals were placed in the windows of existing patients rooms in Ashern's Lakeshore General Hospital where they are expected to remain during the duration of the construction project that is expected to be completed by fall 2024.

Do you have a smoke alarm? Have you checked your smoke alarm lately?

We are running the S.A.F.E. Family program again!

Smoke Alarms for Every Family is a province-wide initiative sponsored by Office of the Fire Commissioner, Red River Mutual, Firefighters Burn Fund and the Manitoba Association of Fire Chiefs again.

The overall goal of Manitoba's S.A.F.E. Family program is to save lives by protecting every home with working smoke alarms and a practised fire escape plan. The RM of West Interlake campaign is part of an effort to reach out to local residents, including older adults, young people and residents of neighbourhoods, who are vulnerable to fire deaths. Installing working smoke alarms in the homes of any West Interlake residents who don't have them will increase

their odds of surviving a home fire. You must be the homeowner to qualify for the program. If you are not sure about your own home or know someone that may

benefit from this program - call to book one of our Fire Personnel to come out and check. We will install up to 2 Dual Smoke Detectors (smoke/carbon monoxide) in each home. Our goal is to make sure residents have the protection of a smoke alarm. Because smoke alarms alone won't prevent every fire death - our project includes educating residents to have a home fire escape plan so they know what to do if the smoke alarm sounds.



- Lundar bi-weekly Lundar East Thursday Next pick-up Nov. 30/17 and Lundar West Friday - Next pick-up Dec 1/17
- 4 bags of household garbage, not to exceed 40 lbs. colored bags
- 2 bags of CLEAN recycling (no limit) blue or clear bag
